The program is for children ages 5 - 12, with a Pre-K playgroup for 2 ½ to 5 year olds. Programs are at 11:00 AM on selected Sundays. The cost will be \$150 for one child, \$200 for families, for the year, payable in two parts. Children (and grand-children!) of members have a reduced rate, and no child will be turned away for financial reasons. Admissions are on a rolling basis.
